What is Title I?

Federal Funds are geared towards improving the Academic Achievement of the Disadvantaged

- Title I of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, provides financial assistance schools with a high percentage of children from low-income families to help ensure that these students meet challenging state academic standards

**What is Title I Schoolwide
Program?**

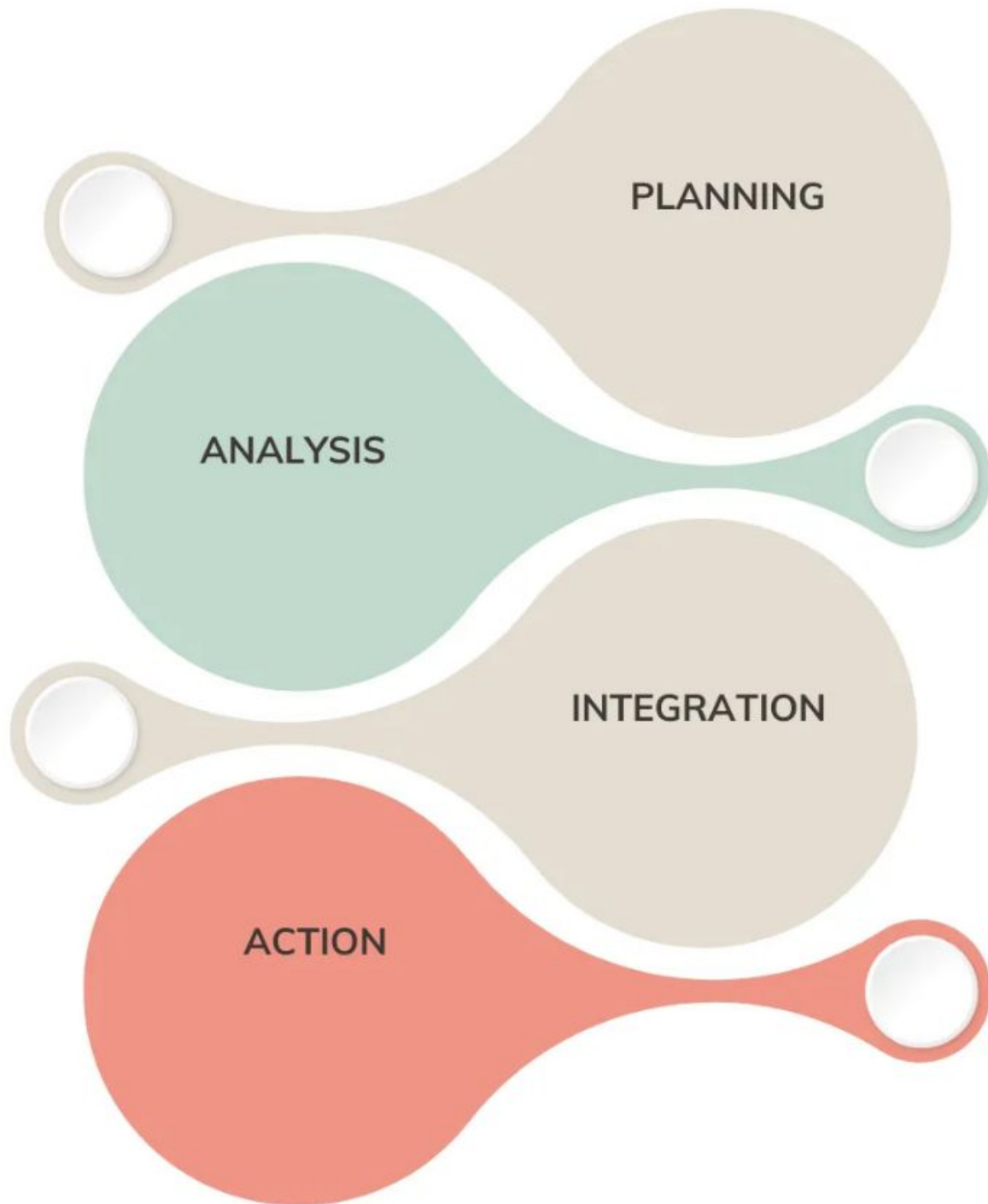


- There are two types of Title I programs a school can operate: targeted assistance and schoolwide.
- MCSCS is classified as a Schoolwide Title I program.
- Title I Schoolwide program is a comprehensive reform strategy designed to upgrade the educational program to improve the achievement of the lowest-achieving students.

MCSCS Comprehensive Schoolwide Plan 2025-2026



- Recruit and retain effective teachers in high-need subjects; provide related training
 - Expand access to advanced coursework and postsecondary credit
- Ensure student access to devices for learning and collaboration
- Implement school climate strategies
 - Use I&RS for early academic and behavioral interventions
- Apply RTI for individualized support to enhance growth and development



MCSCS Title I Schoolwide Program Plan Evaluation



- Analysis of state assessments performance results to determine if the schoolwide program has been effective
- Monitor students' academic performance through an ongoing data analysis and a structured benchmarking system



Step 1 - Bridging the gap between the lowest and highest achieving students

- Screen all students regularly to track progress and identify learning gaps
- Monitor low-achieving students to ensure growth through teacher, counselor, and admin support





Step 2 - Bridging the gap between the lowest and highest achieving students



- Students scoring low on assessments are identified
- Students are assigned to the WIN program
- Students receive one-on-one or small group tutoring daily
- Paired with high-achieving peers for one-to-one tutoring

- Talk with your child about school
 - Volunteer for school events
 - Stay in touch with teachers
 - Monitor grades via Genesis
 - Assist with homework
 - Join the PTSO
